WHAT WE DO

Financial Help

The CCCC provides up to \$300 for

- imminent BGE shutoffs,
- home fuel replenishment,
- water turnoffs
- pending evictions, and
- vital prescription drugs

Restrictions on Financial Help:

The CCCC helps a client or household in our area only once in a 12-month period, except for prescription drugs. And money is given directly to the provider and only when the client provides evidence that the entire amount due, except for CCCC's contribution, has been collected or paid.

Food Pantry

The pantry is located at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, 1800 Seton Drive, Crofton. Hours are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10 am – 3 pm and the first Sunday of the month from 3 pm – 5 pm.

Non-perishable staples are available as well as frozen meats, vegetables, and fruits.

Many of the items provided are from the Anne Arundel County Food Bank. Clients may come only once a month and must reside in Anne Arundel County.

Baby Pantry

The Baby Pantry is located at Community United Methodist Church, 1690 Riedel Road, Crofton, and gives away diapers, wipes, baby food, formula, and baby wash. Hours are on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9 am – 1 pm. Clients may come only once a month and must reside in Anne Arundel County.

Clothes Closet

The clothes closet is located at the First Baptist Church of Crofton, 1690 Crofton Parkway. Hours are on the fourth Saturday of the month by appointment only. Clothing for all ages is available. There are no residence requirements, but the amount of clothing given is limited.

Community Meal

The community meal is located at the Wilson Memorial United Methodist Church, 1113 MD-3 North, Gambrills. Hours are on Tuesday and Thursday from 11 am – 1 pm. No residence requirements; no restrictions on how often may come.
