## **Liturgical Colors – Did You Know?**

The last Sunday of the church year was November 20. The first Sunday in Advent, November 27, was also the first Sunday of the new church year and the beginning of the festival half of the year. This period is referred to as “the time of the Savior,” and encompasses the events of His life on earth. During the four Sundays of Advent, the parament color will be blue. Advent, a preparatory time of waiting and watching, communicates the message of hope. Blue is the color of the sky and helps convey that powerful message. Our Christian faith rests on the hope that Christ, who came in history assuming our flesh, will also return on the last day of time from that same blue sky into which He ascended long ago!

On Christmas Eve the paraments will change to white, a color that symbolizes purity, light, joy, and feast. They will remain white for the Christmas season.

#### **RECOMMENDATION TO CHANGE WORSHIP SERVICES FROM TWO TO ONE ON SUNDAY MORNINGS**

The Worship Team is making the following recommendation for St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Gambrills and Crofton, Md. Our recommendation is to have only one worship service every Sunday from 9:30 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. The worship service will consist of the liturgical opening now being used in the Liturgical Service with the short communion (blessing of the bread and wine, the Lord's Prayer, the distribution, and a prayer) used by the Praise and Worship Service. The organist and the guitarist will share the responsibilities for the hymns and songs for the worship service.

#### **WHY?**

\*We do not have a Praise Band. We have a lone guitarist and a pianist who is not versed in this style of music, but has been willing to learn.

\*Many of the new people are asking why we don't have one service with the number of people attending the worship services. One service would make it easier for all to become more acquainted with each other. (We are attracting more people and they are returning.)

\*One service increases the pool of people willing to serve as Pastoral assistants, ushers, acolytes, and tech people.

\*One service would save us some monies. A Pastor conducting two worship services is offered \$375 and for one service \$200.

\*The entire service is on the screens including the words for the hymns and songs.

\*Sunday School, Youth Group, and Adult Bible Study would be held before the church service with plenty of time for fellowship after the service as recommended by the members of the Ministry Staff.

\*When Pastor Teklu returns one service will be much easier for him.
